The shaded bar for each sound represents two things: Emerging sound (left side of bar): Children at this age make the sound correctly 50% of the time in at least one part of the word. Mastered sound (right side of bar): Children at this age make the sound correctly an average of 90% of the time across all parts of the word. Learning a sound can take a long time
